Registering your Security Cameras with the City of Albuquerque

The City of Albuquerque and the Bernalillo County District Attorney's Office, in conjunction with the Albuquerque Police Department and the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Department, are partnering to create the county's first-ever security camera map. These agencies are encouraging business owners and residents to provide information about their security cameras to assist officers and prosecutions with the investigation of crimes and prosecution of criminals in Bernalillo County.

By participating in this program, you will help law enforcement agencies more quickly identify where video evidence might exist when investigating crimes in your area.

Registration is easy and no one has access to your cameras. If a department needs assistance with a crime in our area and your camera is identified, they will make contact with you to request access to recorded footage. Interested parties can register at https://www.cabq.gov/scan.

Weeds again

Monsoon season will be over soon

and the rains have provided us with a nice summer growth of flowers, bushes and trees. Unfortunately weeds come as part of the territory. Now is the time to take a look around your property, especially in areas you don't regularly visit. Just a reminder, the neighbors that back up to San Francisco, Quintana, Jacobo and Holbrook are also responsible for the weed strip adjacent to the street. A good weed killer is Roundup (there are many different varieties). If you prefer a more natural week killer mixture of vinegar, salt and dish soap is also effective. You can find the full recipe here: https://www.hgtv.com/ outdoors/gardens/planting-and-maintenance/makeyour-own-natural-weed-killer. I personally use a chemical called RM₄₃, it not only kills the weeds, it also is a pre-emergent so it keeps the weeds from coming back for a few months up to 1 year.. Roundup 365 is a similar product purchased from any hardware store. (**Please read the label**).

Recycling Update



Since January you have donated 832 pounds of aluminum resulting in an additional \$260.26 in the HEAR coffers.

Thanks to everyone in our neighborhood who is saving their

aluminum cans. As you can see, it all adds up to many pounds of aluminum! When placing pet food cans in recycling, please remember that only cans and their lids that are lined with white are aluminum. Many pet foods cans are not made from aluminum. And on another recycling note, if you miss the Saturday collection and do not get the bags to me by the next day, please hold onto your bags until the next month's collection in the park.

Treasurer's Report

We started this year with \$19,626.57 in our accounts and we are currently at \$17,607.04. Paid memberships for 2020 stand at 301 (**Thank you**). So far this year we have received \$7,656.62 from memberships and gifts, \$514.01 from recycling, and



\$13.41 from bank interest. Our total expenses this year stand at \$10,203.57. We had a big jump in our expenses due to the wall painting in HEAR and improvements to

the Carriage Estates' Entrance, which account for \$7,516.30. We also had charges for volunteer recognition (\$588.23) and the flier and spring newsletter (\$1,583.05). Additional expenses were for the HEAR PO Box (\$134.00), the HEAR website (\$201.84), the HEAR flag in Rotary Park (\$97.56), and some bank and miscellaneous charges (\$82.59). Membership total is pretty good compared to last year but still low compared to previous years so now is the time to renew or sign up for a membership for the first time.

2020 is an Election Year

Running elections is the responsibility of Bernalillo County. Lots of information is available from their website including hours, locations, sample ballots, absentee voting, early voting, military and overseas voting, Native American and Spanish language assistance. 2020 is a Census year

The decennial census count is mandated by the Constitution (Article 1, Section 2, mandates that the country conduct a count of its population once every 10 years) and conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, a nonpartisan government agency. The 2020 Census counts the population in the United States and five U.S. territories Each home should have received an invitation to respond to a short questionnaire—online, by phone, or by mail—between March 12-20. Those that didn't response should have been received follow-up individual contacts.

The census provides critical data that lawmakers, business owners, teachers, and many others use to provide daily services, products, and support for you and your community. Every year, billions of dollars in federal funding go to hospitals, fire departments, schools, roads, and other resources based on census data.

The results of the census also determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives, and they are used to draw congressional and state legislative districts.

The 2020 Census will mark the 24th time that the country has counted its population since 1790.

Participating in the census is required by law, even if you recently completed another survey from the Census Bureau. A complete and accurate count is critical for you and your community, because the results of the 2020 Census will affect community funding (about \$3700 per person), congressional representation, and more. The 311 Community Contact Center is a centralized call center for the City of Albuquerque. The 311 service is a single telephone number for all nonemergency City of Albuquerque inquiries and services. You can access it in many ways, with the easiest being to just call 311. You can submit a request through your computer or tablet, through the 311 app on your smart phone (my favorite) or even through your Amazon Alexa device. Frequent requests for 311 include (and there are many more) abandoned vehicles, broken or malfunctioning street lights, lost animals, missed trash pick-up, potholes, and weed or litter complaints. You can even submit requests for a large item pick up or request replacement trash or recycle bins. The uses are endless and there are even real people that answer the phone. HEAR Real Estate Update

Real estate in the Heritage East subdivision is alive and well. Home prices have not been hindered by the coronavirus pandemic or double-digit unemployment. For the last thirty years our neighborhood has seen on average a 4 % increase in home values, today we are seeing a Seller's market that defies logic. Nationally, the median home price rose 10.1% year over year in the week ending August 15, 2020. According to the Greater Albuquerque Association of Realtors the average home price in our subdivision increased from \$249,995 in August 2019 to \$300,000 in August 2020, while the average list price increased to \$400,973 from \$327,695 in August of 2019.

Homes sell based on price, location, and condition. In 2019 there were 76 homes that sold in our neighborhood, year to date there have been 42 homes that have closed in 2020. There are two homes for sale in our subdivision now, 9108 Meriwether Ave. NE priced at \$359,900 and 9108 Ridgefield Avenue NE priced at \$465,000, and there are currently 9 homes in our neighborhood pending and scheduled to close in the next 30 days. Until the inventory of homes increase, Heritage

East residents can expect their homes to be a wise investment.

This year historic low interest rates have inspired some of our neighbors to ask themselves, "am I living in my dream home?" In addition to providing a complimentary market analysis of your home, real estate brokers help with resources if you are thinking of relocating, refinancing, or building a new home.

Today Realtors are implementing creative marketing strategies to help ensure that sellers and buyers are safe during this unprecedented time.
